The five hundred dollar Bob Rosen Memorial Scholarship is open to students graduating high school in June 2010, who have participated in varsity athletics and who plan to continue their education. The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of a combination of GPA, extracurricular activities, community service, athletic participation, character references and a 500-word essay. Applicants must have lettered in at least one varsity sport and maintained a minimum of a B average in high school.

The memorial scholarship pays tribute to the late Bob Rosen, a local attorney, who was a life-long resident of Sullivan County and a graduate of Monticello High School. Bob Rosen was a strong community supporter and an avid sports enthusiast. The Bob Rosen Memorial Scholarship serves to perpetuate his memory by assisting a deserving student who embodies the characteristics of athleticism, sportsmanship, scholarship and service.
